Summary

The Supervisory Attorney-Adviser will join a well-respected team that is responsible for evaluating the operation of the Investment Advisers Act and the Commission rules thereunder; for recommending legislative and regulatory changes designed to produce a coherent regulatory structure consistent with the policy objectives of the Act; and for the organization, operation, and execution of all related work programs.

Responsibilities

- Reviewing the laws and rules that regulate investment adviser and investment companies to determine whether the Commission should revise or adopt certain rules or amendments; developing rules that codify certain repetitive administrative actions such as exemptive orders or interpretive positions; and drafting proposed rules, regulations, amendments, and new legislation.
- Managing and overseeing rule making projects, from the initial, formative stages through the Commission's consideration and issuance of proposing and adopting releases.
- Representing the Commission in various matters and advising other Commission programs related to the regulation of investment advisers, such as enforcement and examination matters, disclosure of information by registrants.
- Carrying out supervisory duties, such as performance management, training, awards, and recruitment; keeping employees informed regarding the policies, procedures, and goals of the Commission as they relate to their work on assigned projects.
- Communicating with the Division's Director, Deputy Director, Associate Directors, and with others inside and outside the Division, about progress and developments in rule making matters.

Qualifications

(SK-17): Applicant must have **4 year(s)** of post J.D. work experience as a practicing attorney, **3 year(s)** of which includes: providing legal advice, researching and providing legal interpretation of statutes, and implementing regulations; interpreting and applying the provisions of the Investment Advisers Act or Investment Company Act, as well as the Securities Act and Exchange Act.
